Main Under the overall authority of the Director of the Internal Oversight Service (IOS) and the direct supervision of the Senior Evaluation Specialist, the incumbent will:

- be responsible for the Evaluation Unit's contribution to the evaluation of activities financed from regular and extrabudgetary sources, and in particular for the provision of advice and the necessary methodological backstopping for internal and external evaluation activities; for oversight of implementation of evaluation recommendations and appropriate integration of lessons learned in programme activities of the Organization;
- participate as a team leader, when appropriate, in the evaluation of programmes and projects financed from regular and extrabudgetary sources, and take part, having helped to develop appropriate methodology and performance criteria, in performance /programme reviews related to regular and extrabudgetary activities;
- contribute to the elaboration of performance indicators and measures during the preparation of major planning and programming documents and to the development of guidelines, procedures and methodologies to be applied by evaluators in assessing programmes results;
- be responsible for the design of training modules/material and practical training of Secretariat staff members in the evaluations, and for the improvement and management of the Organizations's database on the evaluation of regular and extrabudgetary activities;
- be responsible for establishing and maintaining working contacts with evaluation units, such as other UN System Organizations, World Bank, bilateral donors etc.

Profile • University Degree in social sciences, business/public administration, evaluation, or related field.

- Minimum of 7 to 10 years of progressivley responsible relevant experience in programme/ project management and evaluation, of which preferably 3 to 5 years acquired at international level.
- Proven experience in at least one of the fields of competence of UNESCO.
- Thorough academic knowledge of evaluation principles and practices with a particular emphasis on developing and monitoring performance measures (knowledge of the Logical framework method would be considered an advantage).
- Good management and coordination skills.
- Good communication skills in an intercultural context (both oral and written).
- Strong analytical skills including the ability to establish links between the Organization strategies and the achievement of the IOS objectives and to identify key issues and opportunities.
- Good level of IT skills (MS Office, use and maintenance of database and tracking system, web-based applications).
- Excellent knowledge of either English or French and good knowledge of the other language.
- **Conditions of employment uNESCO**'s salaries are calculated in US dollars but mainly paid in local currency. They consist of a basic salary and a post adjustment which reflects the cost of living in a particular duty station and exchange rates. For this post, the annual remuneration in local currency will start from around 79,100 euros (73,700 euros if without dependants), exempt from income tax. In addition, UNESCO offers an attractive benefits package including 30 days annual vacation, home travel, education grant for dependent children, pension plan and medical insurance. The initial appointment, which is for 2 years, includes a probationary period of 12 months, and is renewable, subject to satisfactory service. Worldwide mobility is required as staff members have to serve in other duty stations according to UNESCO's job rotation policy. UNESCO is a non-smoking organization.
