## II. INTRODUCTION:

In spite of immense progress in expanding the reach of basic and new ICT services and applications in developing countries, the majority of the world's population, especially in Asia and Africa still does not have access to basic ICT, i.e., telephone service. Computers or the Internet, even broadcast signals are virtually unknown to millions of rural and poor people and the so-called "digital divide" has shifted perilously in recent years to the Developing Countries, with major missed opportunities for the achievement comparable with developed countries in Asia and Africa

ICT access points or telecentres or Community e-centres (CeCs) are public-access facilities providing electronic communication services, especially in marginalized or remote areas where ICTs are not prevalent. They serve as avenues for providing universal access communications and multimedia services to rural communities since they provide access to telephones, faxes, computers, the Internet, photocopiers and other equipment and services. They can have several functions including as an enabler to the communities to access new knowledge and information that can be incorporated into their local knowledge and context, such as, provisions of information on employment opportunities, educational resources, government services and technical information on agriculture for their daily lives, such as information on new varieties, planting techniques, and disease prevention; as a facility to allow entrepreneurs to plan and prepare their business arrangements and to communicate with partners and potential clients from a distance (e-commerce), telemedicine, etc. CeC serves as "virtual roads" or communication highways that can benefit the society.

OIC and IOR-ARC region members and others developing countries of Asia and the Pacific, and Africa have established some and planned to establish more CeCs in rural and remote areas to address the so called digital divide that are providing mostly the above-mentioned services. However, CeCs in many countries are facing the sustainability issues, challenges of coping with the new and emerging technologies (e.g., next generation wireless broadband technologies, WiMax) which are more efficient but somehow beyond the affordability and capacity of such centres), and emerging services. Exchange of information and knowledge, sharing of the knowledge and sound practices, transfer of technology, networking among the CeCs through building/enhancing inter-regional/intra-regional cooperation is considered as the important step to address the above issues, largely.

The current programme aims at reviewing such issues in above region, identify commonalities, share knowledge, and experience, sound practices and design a strategy for intra-regional cooperation and networking of the CeCs for future cooperation, among others.

### Methodology

A three-day programme will be organized by IDB support and the UNESCAP and UNDP of Egypt would most likely provide some sort of support including resource persons. Supports from other international agencies will also be sought and/or they will be invited to participate in the meeting.

## 3. NOMINATION AND SELECTION:

Nominations should be submitted on the application form annexed. Nominating authority is requested to nominate candidates preferably from among the senior policy makers, specialists, researchers and technical staff involved in global changes issues. Moreover, the nominees should have sufficient knowledge of English Language. Selection of candidates would be at the discretion of the Selection Committee; a basic criterion for selection would be the level and work experience of candidates in order that a cohesive and homogeneous group could be gathered for the programme.

The participants would be provided an economy class return air ticket, lodging and boarding during 19-25 December 2010.

Selected candidates would be informed of their acceptance and travel arrangements at least two weeks prior to the commencement of the programme.
