MIDP Supervisors- Key points

- The MIDP is a Split PhD programme which is fully funded by the MOHE (including full tuition fees and living, travel and subsistence costs for the students). Students will continue to be paid their university salary during their studies, and will be provided with additional funding by the MOHE for the travel and living costs during their placements.
- All applicants must be approved by both institutions. The students would be registered as a full-time PhD student at Imperial as well as the host institution. This ensures the student has constant access to the resources at both institutions.
- The PHD is expected to take 3-4 years to complete. The student is expected to complete a minimum of 12 months and a maximum of 18 months of study at imperial. This should be through a minimum of three separate visits. Each visit must be a minimum of 3 months and a maximum of 9 months.
- In order to facilitate the collaboration and the student's research up to three supervisor visits are expected. These are fully funded by the MIDP programme.
- It is intended that the co-supervision and visits will encourage collaboration between staff at Imperial and the Malaysian universities, working in similar areas and support of the Malaysian government's aim of having 70% of all university lecturers educated to PhD level by 2012.
- Both supervisors should ensure the project is workable through the MIDP scheme. A Gantt chart should be submitted to ensure the feasibility of the project.
