Biodata Ringkas

SHAMSUL A.B. (Shamsul Amri Baharuddin) is Professor of Social Anthropology and currently, Founding Director, Institute of Ethnic Studies (KITA), Universiti Kebangsaan Malaysia (UKM). Previously, he was Dean [1997-99], Faculty of Social Sciences & Humanities, Director [1999-2007], Institute of the Malay World & Civilization (ATMA), and Founding Director [2003-07], Institute of Occidental Studies (IKON), of UKM. He has conducted research, delivered lectures and written extensively on the theme “economic development, culture and politics” with an empirical focus on the Southeast Asian region. His award-winning book *From British to Bumiputera Rule* (1986) has been reprinted twice, the latest in 2004. His academic activism includes being appointed as consultant to various ministries of the Malaysian government and numerous international academic bodies. His public advocacy includes being a media commentator on Malaysian current affairs, at the national and international levels. For his academic achievements, he has been awarded the prestigious Academic Prize of the Fukuoka Asian Culture Prize in 2008, and the Distinguished Professor status by the Government of Malaysia in 2010.

PROF. DR. MANSOR MOHD NOOR is a sociologist specializing on ethnic relations and development studies. He has carried out research on ethnic relations at the workplace, in institutions of higher learning and at the community level, involved in planning and evaluating social development impacts at the regional and rural areas, as well as studying voters’ behavior among youth, in the rural areas and at the national level. He has written articles, among others, in the *Journal of Ethnic Studies*, *Akademika*, *Journal of Malaysian Studies* and co-authored a book on ethnic relations in Malaysia. He is a member of the Malaysian Social Sciences Association, International Sociological Association, New Zealand Sociological Association and RCO5 Research Committee on Racism, Nationalism and Ethnic Relations. Prof Mansor graduated with a Bachelor of Social Sciences (Sociology) from Universiti Sains Malaysia, Master of Arts from University of Canterbury, New Zealand and Ph.D. in Ethnic Relations from University of Bristol, UK.

DR. WENDY ANNE SMITH is Director, Centre for Malaysian Studies at Monash Asia Institute and a Senior Lecturer in the Department of Management. She has served as a founding executive committee member of the Australian Government’s Department of Foreign Affairs and Trade Bilateral Council, the Australia Malaysia Institute, 2005-2008. Dr Wendy is an anthropologist who currently teaches Cross-cultural Management, Asian Management and International Business. She studied Japanese and Anthropology at Monash and then received a Japanese Government Mombusho Scholarship to research her PhD thesis, “The Japanese Management System in Malaysia: a Case Study of a Japanese Company Overseas” in the 1970s. She subsequently completed the major fieldwork in Kuala Lumpur, Malaysia. She has been a visiting researcher at Tokyo University, Institute for Social Science, Kyoto University, Centre for Southeast Asian Studies, National Museum of Ethnology, Osaka, Japan, Institute for International Relations, Shizuoka Prefectural University, Department of Anthropology and Sociology, Universiti Kebangsaan Malaysia and Amsterdam Business School. She speaks Japanese and Bahasa Malaysia and has published in English, Japanese, Bahasa Malaysia and German. She is an Editorial Board Member of the RoutledgeCurzon Japan Anthropology Workshop (JAWS) series and the Asia Pacific Business Review.
