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Abstract

The legacy of the Romans and their Latin language to Occidental culture is indisputable. The history of Rome itself is the central theme of Western civilisation while the earlier Greek culture was mediated by Rome through adoption and absorption. Before the dawn of the modern era in Europe, education was the study of Latin and the development of national vernacular languages was indelibly influenced.
